After our "almost closure," in 2018 ... the renovation interruption of the Milton Rhodes Center for the Arts in 2019 ... and the pandemic shut-down of 2020 ... it's taken a while to get back to communications other than email Calls for Art.

WHAT WE'VE BEEN DOING:

New Membership Renewal Schedule: Without staff, keeping track of "who needs to renew when," was no longer possible. So, in January we began our new policy of <u>everyone</u> renewing membership in January for the full calendar year, ending in December of each year. We pro-rated only those

members who renewed or joined during 2020, and they received a separate email from me about that on January 3, following the general announcement.

Our <u>WEBSITE</u> has recently shifted to a new host, and once we get fully acclimated, the content will be updated on a regular basis again. Several updates have been made, but there is more to do, such as, replace photos and move some content around. One of the new goals is to have a calendar of upcoming exhibits, a place for upcoming Calls for Art and prospectus, and add some other new features. It's live and working, but we still have work to do, so please be patient. We are trying to reestablish our Facebook and Instagram pages as well, and we could use some expert volunteer help. Exhibits continue. COVID lockdowns halted everything for most of 2020, but we *have* been doing new exhibits at several locations since September, though receptions haven't been allowed due to CDC restrictions.

The Gallery in the Masonic Center of Winston Salem is always filled by all-member work of Associated Artist members. The current show will be followed by another all-member show. The Masonic Center is normally open and has been having limited events per CDC guidelines, and regular Masonic member meetings, but general public access is somewhat limited at this time.

SALEM FOYER GALLERY

Benton Convention Center

The Salem Foyer Gallery on the main floor features an exhibit of AAWS member art that began January 18. During COVID restrictions, public access is limited to only when there are events, but they too, are beginning to open up. AAWS art for the Salem Foyer is chosen by a juried/curated process. We don't yet know the end date of the current exhibit, and we will send out a Call for Art prospectus when this show changes again.
